The Society is proud to present the 2022 AWTRS EMCR Award to Dr Rachael Moses. A post-doctoral researcher in the Faculty of Medicine, Dentistry & Health Science, University of Melbourne, Rae aims to produce a viable 3D organotypic chronic wound model to replace rodent wound healing models, with the additional aim of replacing animal-derived products within the model. Development of this model will provide a greater understanding of the biology of chronic wounds, leading to more precise assessment of potential novel therapeutics for treatment.
